UU of SCV Hires Rev. Dr. Jason Cook as Our Minister for This Church Year



Greetings!

I'm looking forward to being with you in person for the service on **Sunday, October 6.** Afterward, we will have a **"meet and greet" session** where we can all begin to get to know each other better. As I begin serving as your half-time minister, my initial goal will be to get to know who you are, both individually and as a congregation. What's your personal story? What are your hopes, dreams, and wishes for UU of SCV?

In that spirit, we will soon be scheduling a **visioning workshop to take place in November**. This will be a time to remind us of our mission, discuss what shared ministry means, and set some attainable (but inspirational!) goals for this upcoming congregational year. I already know that this year I'd like to maximize my time with you. While I will be preaching for you on a regular basis, I would also like us to be strategically working toward goals UU of SCV may have in reaching more people in the larger community. How can we do that? Let's discover that together by being intentional in our approach to this shared ministry.

Shared ministry has been a theme throughout my own ministerial career. During my time as Admissions Director for Meadville Lombard, one of two UU theological schools, I worked closely with faculty, staff, and students so that we could meet the changing demands of ministry in these rapidly shifting times. Later, I served as Assistant Minister at Mt. Diablo, one of our largest UU congregations grappling with the changing nature of the role of faith communities in the lives of people today. Again, what happened during that ministry was most successful when it was a collaborative effort. The following eight years I spent at the UU Congregation in Fullerton was a time of rapid growth: moving to a new, larger building; responding to the pandemic; and re-envisioning their Religious Education program. In all these ministries, sometimes the lessons were painful and sometimes there was easily measurable success. But the real strength of the ministry was always found in the relationships that we nurtured. When those relationships are strong, then a

congregation can move assuredly through even challenging times.

Another thing I'm passionate about is the recognition that each of our lives is marked by personally challenging times. In the days ahead, we will look at implementing an on-going **check-in group** which I will facilitate. This will be a place to share struggles with grief, life transitions, caregiving for others, and so on. In my previous ministries, I have run separate grief, caregiver, and self-care groups. I have found that these groups ended up not only serving the congregation's deep spiritual healing needs, but they also served to fill important needs in the larger communities. **Many people end up finding a UU congregation through the presence of these kinds of designated caring spaces.**

My spouse Lawrence (a singer and painter who works as a finance manager at Caltech) and I live in the city of Santa Ana, so, at the moment, Santa Clarita is a bit of a commute for me. Nonetheless, I will be working in the coming days to let you know how we can stay in touch and feel consistently connected throughout my time with you.

Finally, I want to express how profoundly delighted I am to be with you. I have truly enjoyed each person I have met from this congregation. Your warmth, enthusiasm, and love for UU of SCV is palpable. Unitarian Universalism is currently in a place of transition: we are talking more about values than principles these days. **And, most radically, there is a movement-wide shift toward naming "love" as our faith center.** What does that mean for UU of SCV? What opportunities does this present to us right at this moment? I'm excited to explore that together; in this place of inclusive, radical love, I believe there is fertile ground here for us to grow both as individuals and a congregation.


