Special Program: ***Responding to the*** ***Anti-Trans Movement*** **Videos & Discussion, Part 2**

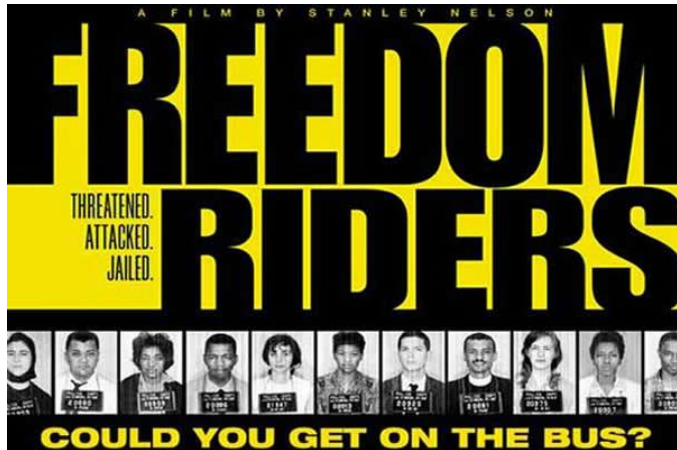

Suzie Rizzo



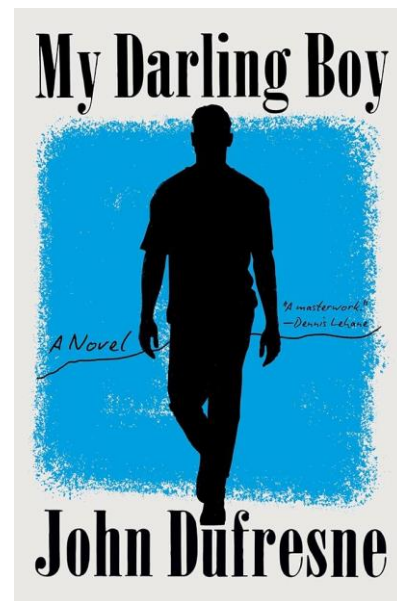

The Animal Ministry Team will be taking a trip to the Gibbon Conservation Center on **Saturday, June 28**. We invite you to join us, too! There will be a guided tour from 10:00 am to 11:00 am.

To attend, please go to www.gibboncenter.org. Reservations are required. You should buy your ticket as soon as you know you are going. Only 20 people are allowed in the tour. Adults are \$20, Seniors and Students are \$15, and Children are \$10.

You may also make an extra donation at the time of purchasing your ticket, if you would like.

Note: We must be extra careful not to take any risk of transmitting any illnesses to the gibbons! Many human illnesses can be transmitted to gibbons. Gibbons can get seriously ill from: Common cold, Flu, Herpes, Tuberculosis, MEASLES, Covid, or anything else that can be transmitted by air or touch! If you have not been vaccinated against MEASLES, or are not otherwise immune, please reschedule your visit after the current measles outbreak has passed.

If you are showing ANY signs of illness or have been recently exposed to an illness, please reschedule your visit. Signs of illness: Fever, Rash, Cough, Sneezing, Sore Throat, Visible Sores, etc. The Gibbon Conservation Center reserves the right to deny admission to anyone who appears ill.
